



Great Bay Yacht Club New Member Information Sheet

Club Objectives:

The primary objective of the GBYC is to promote and support sailing activities. Racing, cruising, and social activities are sponsored by the club as members express interest in these activities.

In order to encourage newcomers and young people to the sport, GBYC is pledged to maintain an economical dues structure, which means the club depends on active participation of its members.

Membership Privileges:

The GBYC provides members with:

- A boat launching ramp at the club property.
- A floating dock for short term loading and unloading use.
- Vehicle parking at the club property.
- A GBYC mooring at the Isle of Shoals and at Adams Point in Little Bay.
- A GUEST mooring at the club property (2 days max.)
- Tie up area for dinghies on the downstream side of the dock.
- Storage lockers at the club property.
- Fresh water hose at the dock
- Chemical toilet at the club property.

Membership Responsibilities:

- Contribution of time or expertise is expected because of our low operating budget. This is a “do it yourself” club.
- Boats or dinghies are not to be left unattended on the upstream or outer end of the dock.
- Members must provide their own mooring, permit, and maintenance. GBYC mooring committee will assist with maintenance arrangements and information where appropriate.
- The club GUEST mooring may be used by one boat at a time for a maximum of two days.
- The GBYC mooring at the Shoals and Adams Point are rendezvous locations for any GBYC member or guest. You must be willing to raft if weather conditions permit.
- Members are encouraged to serve on committees and hold office.
- Members are expected to operate, moor and stow their watercraft in a seaman like manner, and to abide by the club rules, particularly regarding personal property on the club premises.
